He played Minor Country cricket in England for Durham from 1894 to 1914. He was also a rugby player representing Durham and England and touring Australia in 1899. After the tour he stayed in Brisbane and played grade cricket for Fortitude Valley. He gained a place in the Queensland team as a replacement, appearing in the match against New South Wales at Brisbane in November 1899.

He enlisted in the 4th Queensland Mounted volunteers for service in the Boer War and on completion of that service returned to England. At the outbreak of World War 1 he again enlisted. Six weeks before the armistice of 1918 whilst on active duty with the Royal Scots Fusiliers he was killed and is buried at Karasouli Cemetery.

He was educated at Durham School and entered into business with his father as a Stock and Share broker. Adamson set up in business, and ran a hotel in partnership with William Henry Wood and John Adamson, but the business was dissolved on 18 October 1917

He made his first class debut for New South Wales in 1928-29. He moved to Brisbane in 1931 and made his debut for Queensland towards the end of the 1931-32 season, while his last appearance for the State was in 1936-37. In 1933-34 he was selected in an Australian XI to tour New Zealand but the tour was cancelled by the New Zealand Cricket Council. He commenced his cricket in Maitland and in 1925-26 appeared for the local team in the match against the touring New Zealand team.

He played QCA grade for Northern Suburbs (A grade 1931-32 to 1934-35); Valley (A grade 1935-36 to 1936-37). At school he was captain of both cricket and football.

He commenced working in banking and was granted leave for his first class debut match but on further selection was refused leave and so resigned, taking a position with Allan Kippax in his sports business. In Brisbane he was employed by McWhirters Ltd of Fortitude Valley and coached cricket in nets on the roof of the building as well as working in the sports department. He later set up his own sports store but the business failed. He then became a time keeper in the shipping industry and represented on the Federated Clerks Union. On Saturday afternoons he could be found pencilling for a book maker at the races.

He always used the two given names listed but only William was registered.

From 1907-08 to 1911-12 he represented Queensland in five first class matches and also appeared for the State team in the match against Fiji in 1907-08. In March 1919 he played in the match Queensland (capped) v Queensland Colts (uncapped). He played QCA grade for Toowong (A grade to 1919-20); Toombul (A grade?). After missing the season of 1925-26 he played his final season of A grade with Valley in 1926-27, then dropping out of grade cricket to 1929-30 when he returned as captain the B Grade team before ill health forced him to cease playing later in that season. He played some games in the following season and returned to the captaincy of the Valley B Grade team in 1932-33 and then of the Reserve Grade team from 1933-34 to 1935-36.

He commenced his senior cricket with Central Cumberland (now Parramatta CC) in 1907-08 and made an immediate mark as a spin bowler and took 115 wickets with them before his move to Brisbane. From 1913/14 to 1923/24 he represented Queensland in 14 first class matches. He was captain of the Valley A grade team from 1922-23 to 1924-25, was club treasurer in 1922-23 and from 1923 to 1925 was assistant secretary. He was a club selector, member of the Valley Club Executive Committee, and was a club delegate to the Q.C.A. General Committee. At the close of the season of 1921-22 he was a member of Roger Hartigan's Brisbane team to visit Toowoomba and Roma. He had been an outstanding sportsman at school and was a noted rugby and later, lawn bowls player.

He was educated at The Kings School, Parramatta.

He moved from Sydney to Brisbane in his work with Primary Producers. He later worked as an auctioneer.

On 14 November 1928 he was married to Jean Alan KINNEAR and their son, Ryall Sydney AYRES (qv) made four first class appearances for Queensland.

From August 1942 to August 1945 he served as a private in 2 Battalion, Volunteer Defence Corps.

He was a foundation member of the Fortitude Valley Electorate Cricket Club and was elected Honorary Treasurer and Delegate to the QCA at the inaugural meeting on 16 August 1897. He was granted Life Membership on an unknown date.

He was chairman of the Yeerongpilly Shire Council from 1911 to 1913. His family arrived in Queensland on board the Chasley in 1849. In 1874 he and his brother, John Lloyd BALE were founders of the Brisbane Permanent Building and Banking Society Limited, the fore runner to the present Bank of Queensland Limited, John being the company secretary. On the death of John, Ben took over the role of secretary, a position he retained until 1904 when removed by the shareholders.

He went to Europe in 1926 to do post graduate work in skin diseases, returning to Brisbane in 1927 where he practised as a dermatologist. He was appointed lecturer in Dermatology at the University of Queensland Medical School in 1936 and retained that position until 1959. During World War II he was consulting dermatologist to the Army and at Greenslopes Repatriation Hospital and was often the only dermatologist practising in Queensland. He was involved in a number of organisations and in 1975 the Trustees Prize for painting was awarded in his memory.

He played grade cricket for Mosman and North Sydney (1937) before moving to Brisbane where he played for Valley. For a time he played in Lismore before returning to Brisbane in his employment with Woolworths.

In world war two he enlisted in the Australian Army in February 1941, at the time living at New Farm. He served in the Middle East and was selected for an A.I.F. team but was unable to play because of the onset of diphtheria. In 1946 he moved to Rockhampton being now employed by Walter Reid & Co Ltd.

His club cricket was for Grammars in Rockhampton. In February 1948 he was a member of a Central Queensland team to play a match against a strong Brisbane team. In this match he captured six wickets for 77. He suffered from dropped catches and had AH Carrigan dropped twice in his first over to that batsman who then went on to score 184 in 108 minutes with eighteen sixes included in his innings. He later worked in Mackay and would eventually return to Brisbane. After his cricket playing days had ended he played golf and lawn bowls.

Was club patron from 1908 to 1948.

Beirne was elected to the Council of the University of Queensland in 1927 and was warden of the university from 1928 until his resignation in 1941. He enjoyed these associations and in 1935, the university's silver jubilee year, he was persuaded to donate £20,000 to establish the T. C. Beirne School of Law rather than bequeath the £10,000 which he had originally intended.

He was Member of the Legislative Assembly from 1905 until the abolishment of the Upper House in 1922.

He was buried in Nudgee cemetery. His estate was sworn for probate at £1,251,574 in Queensland and £19,225 in New South Wales, with other assets recorded in Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia and Canada; he was one of the few millionaires in Australia. His estate was left to his family, apart from minor bequests to Catholic educational institutions and some charities.

He included five centuries in this record aggregate.

He went on to represent New South Wales in first class matches from 1918-19 to 1920-21 and in seven matches scored 600 runs at an average of 50.00 with three centuries. He toured New Zealand with the Australian Second team at the conclusion of the season of 1920-21 and in eight matches scored 311 runs 38.87. For a time in 1921-22 he played for Glebe and then retired from the game at the higher level to concentrate on his medical career. In Sydney first grade he scored a total of 2418 runs at 35.55, 1960 for University and 458 for Glebe.

For a time he did later play locally in Mossman in North Queensland while working in that town. Then in April 1927 he was a member of EL Waddy's team to tour through Queensland from North to South along the coastal areas. On coming to Brisbane as Resident at Brisbane General Hospital he played grade cricket for Valley in 1928-29 and 1929-30. In fifteen innings in these two seasons he scored 501 runs at 33.40 with a highest score of 138, his only century.

He was educated at Hay District School and at Sydney High School. He subsequently enrolled in an arts degree at University of Sydney, graduating in 1914. He took a teaching position at Shore School but after two years returned to University to study medicine, graduating in medicine in 1920, and in surgery in 1921. After two years he moved to Manly in Sydney and then to Babinda in North Queensland. He retired to Southport in 1947 where he achieved at lawn bowls. In his younger years he had been an accomplished sportsman, performing at baseball, rugby union, tennis and swimming as well as at cricket.

Son of Mary McGUIRE and Hugh BYRNE. He has been referred to as BYRNE and as BYRNES throughout his playing days. His death is registered in the name of BYRNES. He is listed in the Life Members of the Valley District Cricket Club as T BYRNE.

He is known to have played in Maitland and in Newcastle before moving to Brisbane in 1896 to play for the Graziers. He quickly made his mark and was selected in the Queensland team to tour New Zealand in December 1896 and January 1897. He suffered a hand injury just prior to the opening game of the tour, against Auckland, and stood out of the eleven. He made his first class debut for Queensland in the second match of the tour, against New Zealand at Wellington and began by capturing two wickets in each innings of the match. His sixteen first class wickets on tour cost 286 runs. Playing in the three minor matches of the tour he captured a total of twenty-four wickets at a cost of 146 runs. On the return journey he failed to capture a wicket in the two days match against South Tasmania, a game lost by the Queenslanders.

In the following season he played for Woolloongabba and was a member of the Queensland and New South Wales thirteen for the match against the touring Englishmen and put in a good bowling performance on a wicket very much in favour of the batsmen, capturing three for 122 in a total of 636. This was the first major match played on the new Brisbane Cricket Ground, unfortunately it was not first class. Later in the season he was unable to play for the combined Queensland and Victoria eleven in the match that was the initial first class game to be played on the new ground.

He appeared for Queensland in the following seasons, except that he was unable to travel to Sydney in November 1899. He appeared in three matches in each of the seasons from 1902-03 to 1904-05 and was quite successful with the ball. He also provided some useful scores with the bat and in November 1902 recorded his highest first class score of 44, adding 67 runs for the tenth wicket in partnership with AA Atkins as they more than doubled the score. His final first class match was in the season of 1905-06 when he played against New South Wales in Sydney in December 1905.

He made a number of appearances for combined Brisbane teams against teams from Queensland Country areas. The first of these was in April 1898 when he was a member of a team to travel to Rockhampton for a two day game against Central Queensland. He captured nine wickets for the match but the Brisbane batting failed and the team was defeated by 60 runs in the two day contest. He had further success against Central Queensland in the match played in Brisbane in December 1898. He played in the matches against Queensland Country in Brisbane in 1902 and 1903, these matches marking the beginnings of the Country trials. In the 1902 match he captured ten wickets and in 1903 added another eight to his total, this match being played on a wet wicket.

He played QCA grade for Graziers (1896-97); Woolloongabba (1897-98 to 1898-99); Nundah (1899-00 to ?); Fortitude Valley (to 1908-09). John Thorburn records that in 17 matches for Woolloongabba he scored 144 runs and captured 84 wickets with a best in an innings of nine for 12 against Toowong, achieving a clean bowled hat-trick. No other club figures are currently held. His final season was probably 1908-09 when he was playing for Fortitude Valley. He was awarded life membership of the Fortitude Valley Electorate Cricket Club but the year is not known.

He continued in these grades in 1983-84 and also played in 3rd grade. He continued in Under 18 and Under 19 in 1984-85 but moved up to 2nd grade and finally made his debut in first grade. He continued in Under 19 in 1985-86 and also played two games in first grade. He was also called into the Q.C.A. Colts team for four matches, playing for the Colts again in 1986-87.

In 1984-85 he represented Queensland Secondary Schools in the three day match and the one day match against New South Wales Secondary Schools, both matches being played at Maryborough. He also appeared for Queensland Under 19 in the series played in Hobart. In 1985-86 he again represented Queensland Under 19 and was also selected in the Australia Under 19 team. In 1986-87 he appeared for Brisbane Colts in the match against Country Colts, capturing five for 69 and two for 35.

He later made his debut for Queensland in first class cricket, playing against South Australia at the Brisbane Cricket Ground in early January, later in the season making two more first class appearances. He failed to gain representative selection in 1987-88 despite a good season with the ball in grade cricket but did attend the Australian Cricket Academy in the 1988-89 season when he played his grade cricket for University in Adelaide and also made one first class appearance for South Australia.

Back in Brisbane in 1989-90 he resumed his club cricket with Valley and made two further first class appearances for Queensland as well as making his sole List A one day appearance. Early in the season he was a member of the Queensland team for the trial match against Queensland State Squad XI played at Carrara. Later in the season he appeared for Queensland Second XI in the three matches played, the first time a team under the title of Queensland Second XI took to the field of play. He continued to play for Valley in 1990-91 but his 22 wickets came at an average of 38.95. During the season he was a member of the Queensland Second XI for their only match. He commenced playing in the season of 1991-92 but injury ended his playing days before the season was half over.

He played cricket for the Oakfields, for a time affiliated with the South Queensland Cricket Union, this body being amalgamated with the Queensland Cricket Association in 1891. He continued to play for Oakfields until the introduction of electorate cricket in 1897 when he played firstly with North Brisbane and later with Fortitude Valley. He was a dashing right hand batsman and a wicket keeper. In 1890-91 he represented the South Queensland Cricket Union in a match against Toowoomba.

He made two first class appearances for Queensland against New South Wales, the first in Sydney in the season of 1895-96 when he recorded a pair, and the second at Brisbane at the end of the season of 1901-02. In this second match he was more successful with the bat but experienced difficulty with the pace of Albert Henry while keeping wickets. Early in the season of 1902-03 he sustained an injury at practice resulting in a broken bone in his foot and was unavailable to play in that season. W.T. Evans replaced him as the Queensland wicket keeper and retained the position for several years.

In the season of 1892-93 he was Queensland captain and wicket keeper for the second match played in Brisbane against a team from Northern New South Wales, the team being described as the Armidale cricketers. In 1895-96 he played as a batsman in the one day match played by Queensland against Newcastle on their return journey from Sydney.

His early employment was with the Electric Telegraph Department though he is not initially listed in the Queensland Blue Books, listing all permanent staff of the Colonial Civil Service. His first listing was in 1898 when he is recorded as a Letter Carrier with the Post and Telegraph Department, his appointment dating from 1 October 1898. He remains listed until the Department was taken over by the new federal government in 1901. In later years he is listed on the federal electoral rolls as a clerk, though the occupation of letter carrier does continue for another couple of years. In the 1890s he is recorded as having represented the Electric Telegraph Department in cricket matches against their counter parts in Sydney.

He was then appointed attorney-general. The appointment was ratified on 24 January 1881 when he won Beor's Bowen seat. Though unhappy in politics, Cooper held his office and seat until 5 January 1883 when he was appointed to the northern bench of the Supreme Court. He became noted for severity in criminal cases.

He was elevated in October 1895 to senior puisne judge in Brisbane. When Sir Samuel Griffith became chief justice of the High Court of Australia, the Morgan ministry appointed Cooper chief justice of Queensland on 21 October 1903. He was knighted 1904 and was created a KCMG in 1908.

Playing for Toowoomba against the touring team he captured three wickets for 53 from 24.1 overs as the home side took first innings advantage and followed with another wicket in the second innings. With the bat he scored 20 and shared with FN Robinson in a tenth wicket partnership of 54 to take his team to the lead.

In 1898 he moved to Brisbane and commenced playing for Fortitude Valley in the Brisbane grade competition. In November of 1899 he was included in a squad from which the Queensland eleven would be selected to play against New South Wales in Sydney but was omitted from the final team and also missed selection in the game against New South Wales in Brisbane. In June 1900 he moved to Sydney and commenced an association with Leichhardt-Balmain and in 1902 made his first class debut for New South Wales against Queensland. At the end of the season of 1902-03 he travelled to England to join Worcestershire. His first class cricket for Worcestershire was from 1903 to 1914, concluding with the outbreak of war. He then played league cricket and would later become a first class umpire. He was also a cricket coach firstly at Wrekin College and then at Repton College.

Jack Cuffe was a right hand batsman and a left arm bowler who delivered at a slow to medium pace. He died on 16 May 1931 at Burton on Trent in Staffordshire when he drowned in the river Trent. A brother, George Cuffe also played cricket for Fortitude Valley.

After playing one match in A Grade in the season of 1931-32 he was dropped to play in the B Grade team for the remainder of the season, his place in the A Grade being taken by a promising youngster, Ivan Schwenke. At the end of October he was selected as the wicket keeper for a combined B & C Grade team to play a two day match against the Queensland Country Second team. His batting also showed improvement for he reached a highest innings of 55 and recorded 218 runs in fourteen visits to the crease.

Second of four children of Thomas HENDERSON, police constable, and his wife Eliza, née McATEER, both from Ireland. The family moved to the Brisbane suburb of Hemmant where Thomas attended the local state school. In April 1888 he was admitted to the Department of Public Instruction and sent to Kangaroo Point Boys' School as a pupil-teacher; three years later he became an assistant-teacher. He then taught at Ipswich East (1896-97) and Woolloongabba (from 1898) boys' schools. At Holy Trinity Church, Woolloongabba, on 10 April 1901 he married with Anglican rites Maria Ada Mumford, a telephone-operator. From July 1902 Henderson ran the one-teacher school at Glencoe until appointed head teacher of a new school at Rangeville, Toowoomba, in July 1909. He was transferred to Ascot State School, Brisbane, in May 1920, and remained there for nineteen years.

A competent and progressive administrator, Henderson was unusually innovative and creative. His concept of 'the school beautiful' inspired the establishment of attractive grounds, with gardens, flowering trees, bush-houses, rockeries, fish ponds and vine-covered archways. Adventure playgrounds, planned athletic ovals and games courts were added features. Gymnasiums and swimming pools built at Rangeville and Ascot were among the first in Queensland state schools. Appreciating the value of school libraries, Henderson acquired a separate building at Ascot for use as a library and reading-room. He arranged for one teacher to become an art specialist in order to implement an ambitious programme of art, craft and art appreciation. By drawing on the talents of his staff, he decorated schoolrooms with murals of educational and aesthetic value.

Henderson introduced choral work, and founded a bugle band at Rangeville and a brass band at Ascot. Pupils were consistently successful in external scholarship examinations, winning three Lilley medals during this period. Sport was encouraged and a competitive house-system introduced. Well in advance of their general acceptance by the Department of Public Instruction, Henderson established project clubs which promoted pupils' interests in poultry, beekeeping, fish, vegetables and flowers. Ascot held its own annual agricultural and horticultural show. He was also instrumental in establishing a model, one-teacher school within Ascot where teachers-in-training spent some time in anticipation of their service in small schools.

A successful amateur sportsman, Henderson turned out for athletics, cricket, football and bowls. He rose to the rank of lieutenant in the Queensland Teachers' Volunteer Corps and was an officer of school cadets. With the help of his colleagues, he produced several textbooks on mathematics, history and geography; for many years he was an executive-member of the Queensland Teachers' Union. 'Hendy's' reputation was built on his ability to develop his staff, to inspire the co-operation of individuals and to involve communities in his work. Many of his achievements were the more impressive for being accomplished during the Depression. Affectionately regarded as the 'Mr Chips' of Ascot School, he retired on 30 June 1939.

He was educated at the Toowoomba North State School and at Toowoomba Grammar School, being a "Trustees Scholar". He was enrolled at Toowoomba Grammar School on 4 February 1902 and was a Junior Prefect in 1906 and a Senior Prefect until he left the school in the latter part of 1907. He was highly regarded as a student and in August 1907 sat for the Public Service Entrance Examination, coming second in all of Queensland.

He was a member of the First XI, being vice-Captain; the First XV; and the First IV. He was a Subaltern in the Cadet Unit. Of him as a cricketer the school magazine records: "Hutcheon (Vice-Capt.) – the best allround player in the First XI. Fields well anywhere and is a good wicket-keeper. Excellent bat and a good change bowler." He also received high praise as a rugby player.

On leaving school, probably in August 1907 he went to London where he completed his studies for the Bar, where he was admitted. He remained in London for a number of years, being attached for a time to the Agent General's Office. In 1908 he represented Australia at the Olympic Games in London and in 1911 at the Empire Games (Athletics). On returning to Queensland he practised in Toowoomba and Townsville and for a time worked in the Crown Law Office. He enlisted in the A.I.F. in 1917 and served in the 9th Battalion, reaching the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. In the course of the war he was gassed and invalided back to Australia.

He commenced playing grade cricket in Brisbane in the season of 1919-20 when he appeared for the Returned Soldiers. On 22 November 1919 he played for RJ Hartigan's team in the trial match against JS Hutcheon's team, scoring 29. In late December he appeared for Rest of Queensland against the Queensland XI scoring 0 and 40 not out. He made his debut in first class cricket in the final match of the season, against New South Wales played at Sydney in April when he recorded scores of 2 and 8. He was again included in the trial match in 1920-21 but did not appear for Queensland in this season.

Prior to the commencement of the 1921-22 season and with the amalgamation of Goodna, Oxley and Toowong to form Western Suburbs Electorate Cricket Club, the Queensland Cricket Association rejected Returned Soldiers as a participant in the Brisbane competition. Hutcheon now played with Woolloongabba and appeared for Brisbane in the trial match against Queensland Country, and subsequently for Queensland against New South Wales in Brisbane. He was a member of the Queensland team to travel to Sydney for the return match which was abandoned because of continuous rain. He then joined Toombul and again played for Brisbane against Country in 1922-23 season and in December 1922 appeared for Queensland against New South Wales in the State's sole first class match of the season.. In 1923-24 he played in one trial match but failed to gain selection in the Queensland team.

In 1924-25 season he played with Valley but had a poor season. In 1925-26 he batted well in grade cricket and returned to the Queensland team, playing in all four first class matches for the season. That was the end of his first class career. He had one more season with Valley and then joined with Kelvin Grove when they formed for the 1927-28 season, living within the boundaries of the area defined for that club. In 1928-29 Kelvin Grove became Northern Suburbs. He played with the club until 1933-34 and in 1934-35 played a season in the Warehouse Association, but that ended his cricket.

He had been a member of the Queensland Cricket Association Executive Committee, firstly serving as a representative of the Returned Soldiers in 1920-21, representing Valley in 1926-27, while from 1927-28 to 1930-31 he represented Kelvin Grove/Northern Suburbs. He was a Queensland selector from 1927-28 to 1932-33. He prepared much of the material for A History of Queensland Cricket which was finally published in 1946. After his death the work on the history was continued by TJ Bale and completed for publication by VG Honour.

His brother, John Silvester HUTCHEON had represented Queensland in first class cricket and was later to become a well known administrator of the game in this State, being elected Chairman of the Executive Committee in 1920 and President of the Association in 1926, retaining each position up to the time of his death

Later in the season an act of parliament granting the lease of the area at Woolloongabba for a cricket ground was passed and the Trust was formed. In order to arrange matches a Brisbane Cricket Ground Committee was formed with members nominated by each of the Trust and the Queensland Cricket Association. Robbie Macdonald became a member of that committee as a nominee of the Association.

In 1897-98 and 1898-99 he was the Fortitude Valley representative of the Queensland Cricket Association Executive Committee.

His career ended when he changed his residence to live in the North Brisbane electorate in 1904. He wished to continue playing with the Fortitude Valley Electorate Club but the Queensland Cricket Association refused to grant him the required permission, so he made himself unavailable for further cricket in the state and soon moved to England.

He was stated to be on a visit to his son in Canada when he died on 7th March 1946 at Victoria, Vancouver Island, British Columbia.

He commenced his cricket with St Patricks, a Junior club, playing with them until 1921-22. He had shown considerable talent as a right hand batsman and from the season of 1922-23 moved to play with the Fortitude Valley Electorate Cricket Club, soon making his A Grade debut. Without any spectacular performances in Grade cricket he did manage to catch the eye of the State selectors, particularly in the field and in 1924 was a member of the Queensland team for the match against New South Wales played in Brisbane in late November. Though he failed with the bat he was retained for the game against the touring M.C.C. team a week later but once again failed and was not included in the team to travel to Sydney for the game played over the New Year period.

Over the next few years he batted consistently and continued to average in the twenties. In the season of 1929-30 he recorded his highest grade score of 98 not out and for the season took his average to 37.25. In 1930-31 season he batted very consistently and though his highest score was 65 he managed an average of 47.42. With a number of problems developing between some of the Queensland players and the Queensland Cricket Association he was recalled to the Queensland team for the match against the touring West Indies. Once again he failed with the bat and so ended his first class playing days.

He was soon to be married and also found it necessary to spend more time attending to his work and so would soon drop out of grade cricket, though he did make occasional appearances, playing his last A Grade game in 1935-36, when he played mostly in the Reserve Grade.

Clem McFarlane commenced his working career as a clerk with a credit organisation. In the later twenties until the mid thirties he conducted his own business at New Farm. He then became a sales representative. At the outbreak of war he took a job in the South Brisbane Dry Dock and later worked as a clerk in a bacon factory until his death. He was a very religious man and was deeply involved in his local parish activities. On 26th November 1932 he was married in Brisbane to Mary Theresa O'DEA, and there was a family of three children. He died at the inner northern suburb of Grange on 2nd March 1946, the cause of his early demise being cancer of the colon.

In July 1923 he resigned from this position and his seat in the House of Commons on his appointment as Governor of Bombay. He remained in Bombay until 1928.
